Public Notice: Show Cause Directive

July 28, 2023

The DEAC Accrediting Commission provides written notice to the U.S. Secretary of Education, the appropriate state licensing or authorizing agencies and accrediting agencies at the same time it notifies the institution of a decision to direct an institution to show cause why accreditation should not be withdrawn. In addition, DEAC provides written notice to the public on its website of the decision within 24 hours of the decision and provides a brief statement summarizing the reasons for the decision. (Section XV., Processes and Procedures, DEAC *Accreditation Handbook*). At its June 30, 2023 meeting, the Commission voted to continue to direct the following institution to show cause why accreditation should not be withdrawn:

On June 30, 2023, the Commission met to review Anaheim University's (AU) application for renewal of accreditation

The Commission expressed concern with respect to AU's ongoing compliance with DEAC Accreditation Standards I.B, II.A, III.D, III.J, V.A, VII.C, X.A, XI.A, XI.C, XI.D and DEAC Procedures under Part Two, Section XVIII: In-Residence Component. **The Commission therefore voted to direct AU to show cause as to why its accreditation should not be withdrawn and to require AU to undergo a special visit by a team of DEAC evaluators.** The action letter communicating the Commission's decision is available <u>here</u>.

AU is required to provide DEAC with a Teach Out Plan and Teach Out Agreement in accordance with Section XXI.C, Processes and Procedures, DEAC *Accreditation Handbook*.

AU remains accredited by DEAC while the Show Cause Directive is in effect.
